Worshipping the Six Directions

The Reciprocal Social Responsibilities

I. The Eastern Direction

- A. Children worship the eastern direction in relation to parents. They should:
 - 1. support them
 - 2. perform their duties for them
 - 3. keep up the family tradition (e.g., maintain charities they supported)
 - 4. be worthy of their inheritance
 - 5. after their deaths, offer gifts in memory of them.
- B. Parents, showing compassion to their children:
 - 1. restrain them from evil
 - 2. encourage them to do good
 - 3. teach them some skill
 - 4. find a suitable marriage partner for them
 - 5. in due time, give them their inheritance.

II. The Southern Direction

- A. Pupils worship the *southern* direction in relation to teachers:
 - 1. by rising to greet them
 - 2. by waiting on them
 - 3. by being attentive
 - 4. by serving them
 - 5. by mastering the subjects they teach.
- B. Teachers, showing compassion to their pupils:
 - 1. give them thorough instruction
 - 2. make sure they have understood their subject
 - 3. explain all aspects of their craft
 - 4. introduce them to their friends and colleagues
 - 5. provide them protection in all quarters.

III. The Western Direction

- A. A husband worships the *western* direction in relation to his wife:
 - 1. by honoring her
 - 2. by not disparaging her
 - 3. by being faithful to her
 - 4. by relinquishing authority to her
 - 5. by providing her with ornaments.
- B. A wife, showing compassion to her husband:
 - 1. properly arranges her work
 - 2. shows hospitality to his relatives
 - 3. is faithful to him
 - 4. protects his earnings
 - 5. is skillful and diligent in all her tasks.

IV. The Northern Direction

- A. A friend worships the *northern* direction in relation to his friends and colleagues:
 - 1. by gifts
 - 2. by kindly speech
 - 3. by promoting their well-being
 - 4. by treating them like himself or herself
 - 5. by being truthful and not misleading them.
- B. The friends and colleagues, showing compassion to a friend:
 - 1. protects them when they are heedless
 - 2. looks after their property and belongings when they are heedless
 - 3. serves as a refuge when they are afraid
 - 4. does not desert them when they are in trouble
 - 5. shows concern for their children.

V. The Nadir

- A. An employer worships the *nadir* in relation to his workers:
 - 1. by assigning them work according to their ability
 - 2. by providing them with food and wages
 - 3. by looking after them when they are ill
 - 4. by sharing special foods with them
 - 5. by giving them vacations at a suitable time.
- B. The workers, showing compassion to their employer:
 - 1. get up before him
 - 2. retire at night after him
 - 3. take only what they are given
 - 4. do their work properly
 - 5. uphold his good reputation.

VI. The Zenith

- A. A householder worships the zenith in relation to ascetics and brahmins:
 - 1. by doing work for them with loving-kindness
 - 2. by speaking to them with loving-kindness
 - 3. by thinking of them with loving-kindness
 - 4. by opening their doors to them
 - 5. by supplying their material needs.
- B. Ascetics and brahmins, showing compassion to householders:
 - 1. restrain them from evil
 - 2. encourage them to do good
 - 3. are compassionately benevolent towards them
 - 4. teach them what they have not learned before
 - 5. improve their knowledge of what they have learned
 - 5. point out the path to heaven.
